# **Exhibition Information**

The history of art is full of examples of interrelation, "collaboration" and reciprocal influence between exponents of different artistic genres. We could mention poets, novelists and writers in general who have inspired their literature in visual artworks, such as the formidable influence of El Greco on Spanish and universal literature. We can also refer to the frequent exchange of ideas between Picasso and Stravinsky; and to how much the music of Tomás Marco inspired Joaquín Michavila 's paintings.

More recently we can talk about the "collaboration" between artistic partners, such as painter Emilio Vedova and composer Luigi Nono; or the one between painter Jackson Pollock and composer Raphaël Cendo.

But we want you to focus in this exhibition, on poems and song lyrics as sources of inspiration for visual artists.

We invite you to create and submit works of painting, drawing, engraving or collage, inspired by poems or song lyrics. That's the challenge this time.

The resolution of the image of the works you will submit is of great importance, so that their quality and artistic values can be clearly appreciated by the Gallery and the curator. For this reason, images that have a minimum of 1500 pixels are recommended.

Just as important as the quality of the image is the text written by you, in which you will convincingly explain the relationship between your visual artwork and the poem or song lyrics that inspired it. We request to include as part of that text or description the fragments of the poem or the song lyrics that were your source of inspiration.

We want to emphasize that in addition to the artistic and creative values of visual artworks, the Gallery and the curator attaches great importance to the description you submit together with the image. Please take this into account.

Inspired by: Song "Wealth" by rock band Tangra (Text by Alexander Petrov)

My work "Conversation with the Stars" is deeply inspired by the eternal Bulgarian song "Wealth" performed by the rock band Tangra. The song captures a poetic and philosophical reflection on the true riches of life — life under the stars, with a heart full of dreams and questions about the universe.

In the painting, the abstract window and vibrant colors symbolize the artist's "doorway" to the stars, echoing the text: "The window is my door and I walk towards them and question them" The girl looking up represents the dreamer in all of us, longing for a connection with the cosmos , asking eternal questions about love, art and existence. The stars shine as witnesses of our struggles and hopes, proof of the beauty of Life: "...there is the greatest wealth — one window and countless stars"

Through this artwork, I celebrate the song's universal message: our richest possessions are often our simplest—our dreams, our art, and the stars above.

Those clouds are the shadow of a fruitful future,


Which humanity, like a beautiful spring, will renew...





Through emotions caught.





Hamid Tibouchi's poem that says: "When the table remembers... when the chair, the cupboard, the sideboard remember... when they intensely remember the roots, their sap, their leaves, their tops... everything that lived within them, the nests and the songs, the squirrels and the monkeys, the snow and the wind (....) a chill runs through the house, which becomes a forest again." moved me. The tree speaks to us of mystical meanings, of elevation and eternal life, as evidenced by the symbolism of the tree of life developed in ancient cultures. I wanted to capture those feelings that its presence generates in me in a series of paintings called Brother Tree. As a mere instrument of the divine, I have tried to communicate that intense sensation of life, that great creative force, that latent energy, ready to materialize, that I sensed near the trees.

This poem by Tibouchi awakened in me that awareness of the nostalgia for wood, which was once a tree, transformed into lifeless furniture and objects.



# **Steve: Quet Night Thoughts**





Li Bai (701-762), or Li Po, is one of the greatest masters of Chinese poetry, and 'Quiet Night Thoughts' is a beloved testament to his skill. It's often a first encounter for students of classical Chinese poetry, and likely the first that many of us attempt to translate.

In just twenty words, Li Bai captures a moment of waking wonder and deep homesickness. He sees moonlight, mistakes it for frost, and then is overcome with longing. This emotional simplicity is a hallmark of Chinese poetry, and this poem resonates deeply with me.
