## Our Image of God and Our Transcendent World

For centuries in the history of European Christian painting, the display of faith in God has been an almost exclusive theme. Until the mid-1800s, the Greco-Roman legend and the Bible provided the main source for painters and sculptors. In the Jewish, Muslim religion, this turned out differently, there was no free figural representation. With the advent of modernism, painters rarely touched on sacred themes. I would like to revive this a bit with my application. I wonder how in the present situation the creators articulate their faith, their relationship to the transcendental world, regardless of which part of the world they live in, which religion they feel are their own. Since atheism is also a form of faith, I want their worldview to appear as well.



My artwork, Corpus, represents one stage in the search for God that attempts to explore the layers of the world of matter, not visible to the naked eye but physically real, to make visible the core, the all-powerful force, the energy, the light — that which is the same in everything that functions. This is, perhaps, God himself. Corpus means "body." Although the figure refers to Jesus Christ and his destiny, the features of Jesus are deliberately not seen, but simply those of an average man.

In his posture, there is the symbolism of the cross — a symbol of paramount importance in many religions and cultures around the world. It is the intersection of heaven and earth, the center that must be sought within ourselves and in others. There within lives the miracle that allows everything to function — our body, the core of our planet, the universe.







#### **Curator's Note**

I was really looking forward to seeing the entries received. I am very pleased that the works came from many countries around the world. Due to the nature of the topic, most of them are from Hungary. The selection criteria was as follows: display as many techniques and styles as possible. Let the many images of God on Earth appear in the creations. I regret that the material was a bit monotonous in this regard, as it was primarily the Christian religion that was the starting point. That's why I was happy with works that approached this in the spirit of universality. What was important to me was the compositional solution, the technical execution of the images, and also the need to express something to "stop" us for a moment.

For the Curator's Award — Carloslascano: Heavy Burden.

The composition of the painting based on the golden ratio and the use of complementary colors provide a solid foundation for the eloquent gaze of Christ. In this face is all the pain of the last 2000 years.
